Vue Set to Show First National Theatre Live Autism Friendly Screening of The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time

The production tells the story of 15 year-old Christopher John Francis Boone, who has Asperger's Syndrome. The screening will allow cinema goers who benefit from the subtle alterations made to the sensory-friendly cinema experience, to watch the powerfully moving production with friends and family in an inclusive surrounding.
