



Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy catch-up premium

Background

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provides schools with an additional £500 for each year 7 pupil who did not achieve at least National Curriculum level 4 in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2.

It is provided to all state-funded schools with a year 7 cohort, including special schools, alternative provision (AP) settings and pupil referral units (PRUs).

Purpose

The purpose of this funding is to enable schools to deliver additional support, such as individual tuition or intensive support in small groups.

We receive this additional funding to enable us to provide year 7 pupils with additional support in literacy and/or mathematics. The funding has been used to provide additional support to your child whilst in year 7 to reach their full potential.

How is the premium spent?

We assess individual pupil need to inform the best way to use the additional funding which may include:

- individual tuition in addition to classroom teaching
- Additional staffing to support differentiated learning experiences
- intensive small-group tuition
- purchasing external services and materials to add to those provided by the school
